

At the end of page 294 - it is stated, that this part of the work had been happily brought to a conclusion by the diligence of D^r. Hartmann Schedel, in the city of Nuremberg. 1493.

At page 295 a history of countries and cities & commerce, which is continued to page 338. where it is said that this Liber Chronicarum had been happily finished and printed in the Imperial City of Augusta - by John Shensperger. in 1497.
